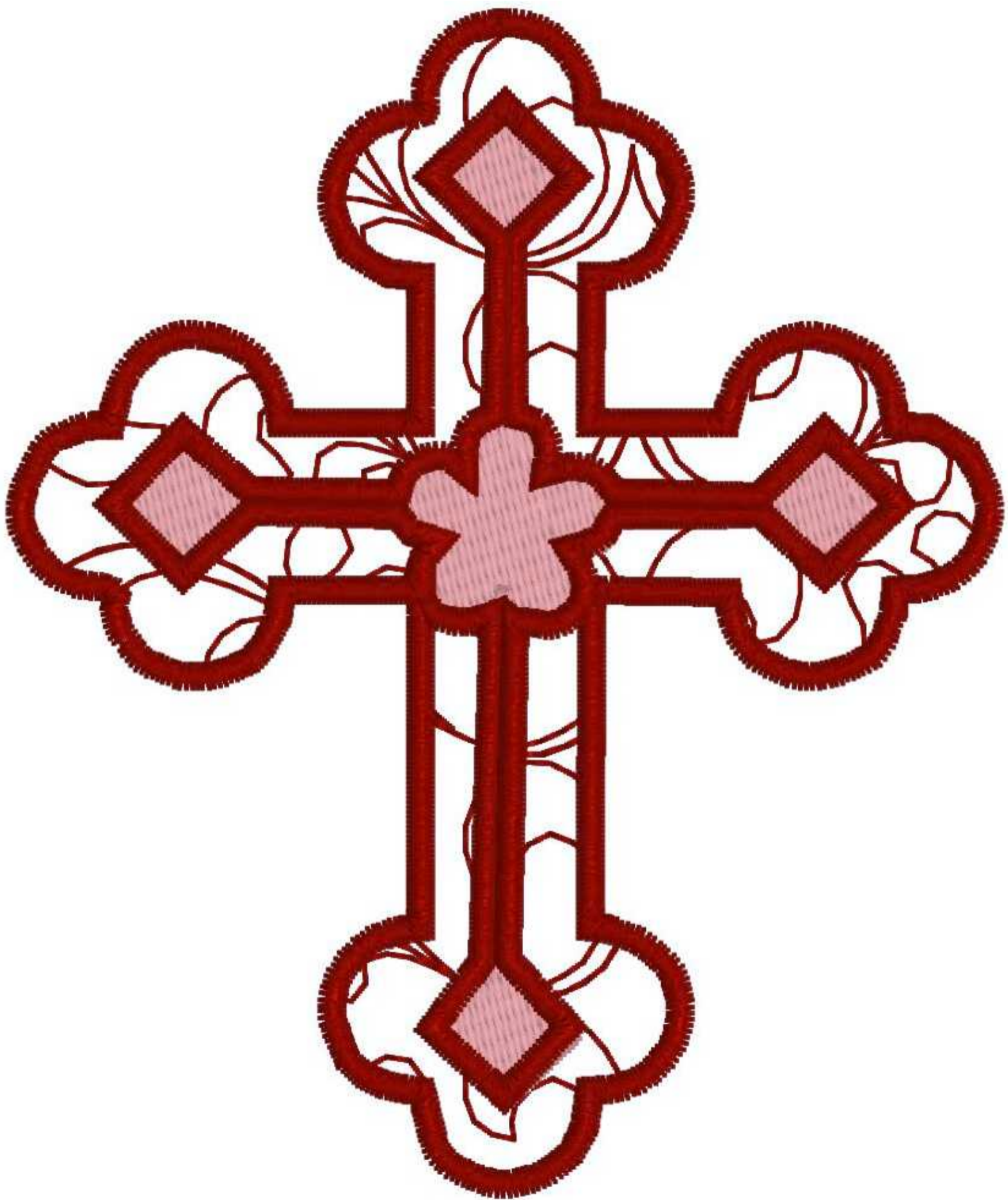





- + Deliver me from my persecutors, for they are stronger than I.

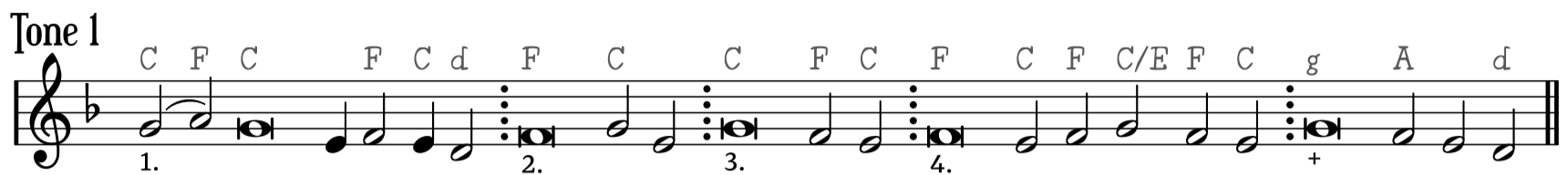
